ENTRY FEES: 18 & over - \$10 per entry per class 17 & Under - \$5 per entry per class.

DRUG FEE: \$5 per horse.

STALLS: \$35 for 5 nights. No shavings included. Shavings will not be available for purchase on the grounds. Barn form must be completed and submitted with entry form. All stall assignments will be made by Horse Show Manager. No stalls may be changed without permission of the Horse Show Manager. Stalls will be ready for use after 5:00 pm Wednesday, September 1, 2010. No early arrivals will be allowed. **ARENAS WILL BE CLOSED BEGINNING SUN. 8/28 AND WILL RE-OPEN WED. 9/1 5:00 pm**

PASSES: Discounted fair admission passes are available to horse show participants and must be purchased at the time of entry. Fair admission passes may be purchased for horse show exhibitor only: for youth exhibitors, discounted passes may be purchased for parent(s)/guardian(s) to accompany the child. Admission passes include fair admission for all five days of the fair. Arena event Tickets (concert, rodeo, truck pull & destruction derby) may be purchased from the fair ticket office.

**5-Day Adult Fair Admission: (13 & Over): \$20/person (\$35 value) 5-Day Youth Fair Admission: (12 & Under): \$10/person (\$25 value)**

PARKING: One parking pass will be issued per exhibitor. Parking will only be allowed on the east side of Barn #5, near the Mule Days Office. Parking is prohibited in any other area of the fairgrounds. Violators will be towed at owner's expense. Parking pass, with exhibitor name, must be clearly displayed on dashboard. Vehicle parking pass is not valid for gate entry: each person in vehicle entering fairgrounds must have admission pass.

HORSE SHOW RULES: HORSE SHOW PRODUCED BY THE EASTERN SIERRA TRI COUNTY FAIR.

FAIRS MAY CREATE "LOCAL RULES" THAT MAY BE STRICTER THAN THE STATE RULES BUT MAY NOT CIRCUMVENT THE STATE RULES. IF A LOCAL RULE IS NOT PRINTED IN THE EXHIBITOR HANDBOOK, THE APPLICABLE STATE RULE WILL APPLY.

1. Horse show is open to all exhibitors with no limitations as to city, county, or state of residence.
2. Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes with fewer than 3 riders. Fair management reserves the right to excuse a horse or rider. Decision of Fair management in final.
3. Horse Show entry fees are non-refundable for dropped classes. Refunds will only be issued upon verification from a veterinarian or other physician (in the case of an individual) of injury to the horse or rider.
4. Show will follow USEF (United States Equestrian Federation) rules, as long as those rules do not conflict with California State Rules, Department of Agriculture, Fairs and Expositions.
5. Age of youth is considered as of January 1, 2010. **Exhibitors must be 5 years and over, as of January 1, 2010.**
6. Exhibitors in lead line classes must be accompanied by a responsible adult 18 years or older. **Exhibitors in Lead Line, Walk-Jog (Trot) and 5-8 Lope(Canter) classes must wear a USEF approved helmet at all times. Helmets are recommended, not required for all other exhibitors. Approved helmets are required in all English and Jumping Classes.**
7. No one under the age of 18 may show a stallion.
8. Exhibitor's number must be visibly displayed on the Exhibitors back while in the show ring.
9. At the time of entry, exhibitors showing more than one animal in the same class must declare which exhibitor/animal combination will be receiving points.
10. **Champion Trail:** 1<sup>st</sup> place in designated classes will be eligible for the Champion Trail Class. Exhibitors qualifying the same exhibitor/animal combination will be allowed one go.
11. High Point Awards to be tabulated by exhibitor/animal combination. High Point Awards Ceremonies to be held ½ hour following last class of each day.
12. Horse Show Points to be calculated as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> place=6, 2<sup>nd</sup> place=5, 3<sup>rd</sup> place=4, 4<sup>th</sup> place=3, 5<sup>th</sup> place=2, 6<sup>th</sup> place=1. When there are less than six ribbons awarded in a class, points will be based on the number of places awarded in the class. For example, if only 4 placings are awarded, 1<sup>st</sup> place=4, 2<sup>nd</sup> place=3, 3<sup>rd</sup> place=2 and 4<sup>th</sup> place=1. Points to be tabulated by Tri County Fair appointed committee and verified by Tri-County Fair Horse Show Management.
13. In Western Div., animals 5 years and under may show in snaffle bit or hackamore and rider must use 2 hands on reins. Animals 6 years and over must be shown in a bridle with one hand on reins. Animals shown in bridle must use a standard western bit, with maximum length no longer than 8 ½" and a port no higher than 3 ½ ". Jointed mouth pieces are acceptable. No mechanical hackamores.
14. **Rookie Mules and Rookie Horses** are those who are in their 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year of showing under saddle at the Eastern Sierra Tri County Fair. May be any age. **Rule # 13 applies.** Exhibitor must be 9 years and older. Animal may not cross enter with the exception of Halter Classes and Eastern Sierra Sliders Charity Western Pleasure Class.
15. No schooling in any class permitted.
16. Exhibitors must be ready when class is called. Exhibitors will be given a two (2) minute call before their class.
17. Patterns for Showmanship, Jumping and Trail will be available in the Horse Show Office the morning of the event.
18. **Lead Line and Walk-Jog (Trot)** may not cross enter regardless of exhibitor/animal combination.
19. **5-8 Lope (Canter)** designed to encourage those exhibitors to begin showing the lope and canter gaits. May not cross enter regardless of exhibitor/animal combination with the exception of Hunter Cross Pole Junior 17 & Under classes.
20. **Hunter Cross Pole Jr./Am.** designed to encourage participation by the beginner or challenged rider. May not cross enter in any other Hunter/Jumper Classes regardless of Exhibitor/Animal Combination. Cross Pole Jr./Am. course may be modified at the discretion of Tri County Fair Horse Show Management.
21. **Handy Hunter** please refer to USEF rule book HU 122 # 6.
22. At time of entry, exhibitors wishing to register for Amateur classes will be required to provide horse show manager either (a)Current Amateur Card issued by recognized sanctioning body to include, but not limited to, USEF, AHSA, NRHA, AQHA, AMA: or (b)Completed and signed affidavit indicating amateur status as provided by any Equestrian Organization.

**AMATEUR DEFINITION:** A person who does not give riding lessons and/or ride, train, or show horses for money or assist the spouse or immediate family in this activity. This includes a person under the age of 18 years. The management reserves the right to question anyone's amateur standing if the question of status has been presented with reasonable cause. The decision of the horse show management shall be final. (State Rule XI.2)

## RULES:

1. Reining show will be governed by ESS and NRHA rules, providing that these rules do not conflict with California State Rules Department of Agriculture, Fairs and Expositions.
2. Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry. No post entries accepted. **Refunds and Substitutions:** Entry fees are non-refundable for dropped classes. Refunds will only be issued upon verification from a veterinarian or other physician (in the case of an individual) of injury to the horse or rider. Horses declared to be unfit at the time of the show because of unethical substances or an illegal act or substance, are the responsibility of the exhibitor. **Substitutions** will be allowed subject to review and approval by Tri County Fair Management.
3. ESS Membership roster to be provided to Horse Show Manager prior to entry acceptance dates.
4. Order of Go will be posted in the Entry Office the day prior to the show.
5. Patterns will be available in the Entry Office the day of the show.
6. ESTCF Ribbons awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> place. ESS Points awarded 1<sup>st</sup> through 10<sup>th</sup> place.

## CLASS DISCRPTION: No

**OPEN:** Any horse ridden by any rider. Points earned by horse.

**NON-PRO:** A non-pro shall be defined as any person who has not directly shown, trained, given lessons, or assisted a spouse or immediate family in the training of a horse for remuneration in the past 5 previous calendar years. Points earned by Rider/Horse.

**LITTLE BRITCHES:** A class for youth 10 years old and under. Age of youth is considered as of January 1, 2010. Points earned by horse/rider. Riders will ride Pattern 11. Helmet recommended. May not enter any other class.

**YOUTH:** A class for youth 17 years & under. Age of youth is considered as of January 1, 2010. Youth may ride any horse. Points earned by rider/horse. Helmet recommended.

**GREEN RIDER:** A rider in their first year of showing reining horses in *any equestrian club*. (Two spins and no lead changes required in this class). May be ridden two handed with any legal bit. Points earned by rider/horse. **Note:** Green Rider is anyone, (except horse trainers) who has never competed in a reining class no matter how long they have ridden or competed in other disciplines.

**BASIC REINER:** Non-pro or youth rider in their first 3 years of showing reining horses, who have not won any year end awards in any club (Excluding Green Rider, Basic Reining and Ever Green) Points earned by rider/horse.

**ESS ROOKIE:** Any declared Non-Pro or Youth rider may show who has not earned \$200.00 in lifetime earnings in any reining or won 4 or more year-end reining titles from any equestrian club. (For example: ESS, Saddle Club, RHAN). Points earned by Rider/Horse.

**GREEN HORSE:** Horse's first year of showing in reining. Horse can be of any age. Points are earned by horse.

**SNAFFLE/HACKAMORE:** Horses 5 years or younger may be shown in snaffle bit or bosal hackamore. Points are earned by horse.

**NOVICE HORSE OPEN:** Horses not to have won \$5,000.00 in lifetime earnings in any reining. Points are earned by horse.

**NOVICE HORSE NON-PRO:** A declared Non-Pro rider may show a horse who has not won more than \$5,000.00 in lifetime earnings in any reining. Points are earned by horse/rider combination.

**MULE:** Burro/Donkey and Horse Cross. Points are earned by Mule.

**MUSTANG:** Any BLM Branded Mustang. Points are earned by horse.

**ESS CHARITY WESTERN PLEASURE:** Open to any horse and any rider. Year-End points are tabulated for horse/rider. The proceeds raised in this class will benefit a worthy cause, selected by the ESS Membership at the end of the ESS Show Year.

**IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER**

A Message From Jim Tatum, Fairgrounds Manager

1. Horse Show contestants will be allowed to enter the grounds at 5:00 pm on Wednesday, September 1, 2010. This will allow adequate time for barn decoration and acclimation of the animals. Arrival prior to this time greatly impacts the ability of fair staff to safely complete many tasks necessary to produce an event of this magnitude.
2. It is against the law to bring alcoholic beverages to the fairgrounds. Violation of this law jeopardizes the fair's liquor license and could ultimately result in the elimination of such sales. Glass containers of any type are also prohibited.
3. Parking in the barn area creates a significant safety hazard violates State Fire Marshall regulations and generally results in chaos. Short-term stopping is allowed to unload stock. When finished, please proceed to the parking areas east of Barn 5 and north of the Mule Days Office. Remember, parking space is limited. Please park in a manner that is safe and maximizes the available space.
4. The Tri-County Fair horse show is intended to be a fun event, focusing on the exposure of all ages to the world of competitive showing. Every effort is made to provide classes conducive to maximum involvement.

Weather you are a seasoned veteran or relatively new to the show ring, please take this opportunity to interact with other competitors. Much can be learned by watching those with extensive experience and much can be gained by helping those with less experience.

The Eastern Sierra Tri-County Fair Horse Show is produced by the ESTCF in cooperation with the Bishop Saddle Club, Eastern Sierra Sliders and managed by Karen West. Please treat them with respect and utilize them as a sounding board for potential improvements for future shows.

Thank you in advance for participation in the 2010 Tri-County Fair Horse Show, and remember HAVE FUN!

## **FREESTYLE REINING RULES**

The Freestyle Reining class is open to everyone. Freestyle reining provides an opportunity to use reining maneuvers creatively, but also to expand them to music by means of choreography. Riders are encouraged to use musical scores which permit them to show the athletic ability of the horse in a crowd appealing way.

### **Required Maneuvers:**

1. A minimum of 4 consecutive spins to the right.
2. A minimum of 4 consecutive spins to the left.
3. A minimum of 3 stops.
4. A minimum of 1 lead change at the canter from right to left.
5. A minimum of 1 lead change at the canter from left to right.

### **Freestyle Rules:**

1. Exhibitors will only be judged astride.
2. Time Limit – a maximum of 4 minutes including any introductions. The time limit will be from the beginning of the music or the introduction (which ever comes first) and will end with the music.
3. Failure to perform all the required maneuvers or failure to complete the performance within the time limit will result in a score of 0.
4. Exhibitors are allowed to use two hands (as well as one hand or no hands) and any approved bits including snaffle bits or bosals.
5. Costumes are permitted but not required. Emphasis is placed on performing the reining maneuvers to music.
6. All equipment used must be non-abusive to the horse.
7. Additional maneuvers such as rollbacks, backups, speed variations, and non-classical reining maneuvers such as the half pass and side pass are appropriate in Freestyle and shall be given appropriate credit.
8. Additional repetitions of required maneuvers are appropriate, but will only add or subtract from the existing scores given for the required maneuvers, not as additional scores.
